

SCAVENGER HUNT THROUGH ISAIAH AND THE NEW TESTAMENT

DIRECTIONS: On 5x7 index cards, write the Scripture verse from Isaiah on one side and the verse from the New Testament on the other side. Distribute the cards to your class participants. Ask them to find each of the verses in their Bible to discover how God revealed his word through Isaiah's prophecies in the Old Testament and also through Jesus as the fulfillment of those prophecies in the New Testament. Give them 5 minutes to find the verses for each card and ask them to read their verses aloud to the class.

| 1. Will be born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14). | Was born of a virgin named Mary (Luke 1:26-31). |
| 2. Will have a Galilean ministry (Isaiah 9:1-2). | Ministry began in Galilee of the Gentiles (Matt 4:13-16). |
| 3. Will be an heir to the throne of David (Isaiah 9:7; 11:1, 10). | Was given the throne of his father, David (Luke 1:32-33) |
| 4. Will have his way prepared (Isaiah 40:3-5). | Was announced by John the Baptist (John 1:19-28). |
| 5. Will be spat on and struck (Isaiah 50:6). | Was spat on and beaten before His crucifixion (Matt 26:67). |
| 6. Will be exalted (Isaiah 52:13). | Was highly exalted by God and the people (Phillippians 2:9-10). |
| 7. Will be disfigured by suffering (Isaiah 52:14; 53:2). | Was scourged by Roman soldiers who gave Him a crown of thorns (Mark 15:15-19). |
| 8. Will make a blood atonement (Isaiah 53:5). | Shed his blood for our sins (1 Peter 1:2). |
| 9. Will be widely rejected (Isaiah 53:1-3). | Was not accepted by many (John 12:37-38). |
| 10. Will bear our sins and sorrows (Isaiah 53:4-5). | Died because of our sins (Romans 4:25; 1 Peter 2:24-25). |
| 11. Will be our substitute (Isaiah 53:6-8). | Died in our place (Romans 5:6; 8:2; Corinthians 5:21). |
| 12. Will voluntarily accept our guilt and punishment for sin (Isaiah 53:7-8). | Jesus took on our sins (John 1:29; Romans 6:10; Corinthians 5:21). |
| 13. Gentiles will seek Him (Isaiah 11:10). | Gentiles came to speak to Jesus (John 12:20-21). |

| 14. Will be silent before His accusers (Isaiah 53:7). | Was silent before Herod and his court (Luke 23:9). |
| 15. Will save those who believe in Him (Isaiah 53:12). | Provided salvation for all who believe (John 3:16; Acts 16:31). |
| 16. Will die with transgressors (Isaiah 52:12). | Was numbered with the transgressors-two thieves on either side of His cross (Mark 15:27-28; Luke 22:37). |
| 17. Will heal the brokenhearted (Isaiah 61:1-2). | Healed the brokenhearted (Luke 4:18-19). |
| 18. God's Spirit will rest on him (Isaiah 11:2). | The Spirit of God descended on Jesus (Matt 3:16; Mark 1:10; Luke 3:22; 4:1). |
| 19. Will be buried in a rich man's tomb (Isaiah 53:9). | Was buried in the tomb of Joseph, a rich man from Arimathea (Matt 27:57-60; John 19:38-42). |
| 20. He will judge the earth with righteousness (Isaiah 11:4-5). | Jesus was given authority to judge (John 5:27; Luke 19:22; 2 Timothy 4:1-8). |
